HOMELEA ARRIVES.

Melancholy Fate

St. John's, Ndd., Aug. 11.—The British steamer Homelea, Montreal for Fleetwood, which went ashore at Point Riche, Belle Isle Straits, August 7, arrived here to-day for repairs. She was shoated off the rocks at high tide last Saturday with the aid of the British warship Fantome, and arrived here under her own steam. Divers report that there is no hole in her bottom, but that she is badly dented where she struck on the ledge, and is leaking considerably.
