ELEVENTH YEAR. FIGHT 'EM SINGLE HANDED. HOW A CANADIAN M.P. ROUTED ENGLISH SAUVAGES.

OTTAWA, Feb. 27.—The feature of today's proceedings in the Commons was the discussion on the motion by Mr. Taylor for a second reading of his bill for prohibiting the importation of alien contract labor. His rich experience in this connection was highly interesting.

The question bill daily introduced to the House proceeds to the transaction of business proved more interesting than usual today. Hon. Edward Bruce was chief interrogator and opened with the enquiry whether there had been any correspondence between the Government of Canada and the Imperial Government.

Mr. Taylor said that he had been informed that the Government of Canada had been in correspondence with the Imperial Government regarding the relations between Newfoundland and Canada.

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Nicholas Flood Darwin voted on both sides, but explained amidst the laughter of the House that he favored the bill and his first vote was a mistake.

The reciprocity-in-wrecking bills headed the order paper for today, but when the House adjourned their consideration was deferred for the present.

Mr. Charlton suggested that the bills be referred to a special committee, reading being deferred for the present.
