Few know, how-ever, that really more than one-half of the deaths revorted are caused by these diseases. The returns for Nov-ember up to date show that 108 deaths have seen reported. Of these 30 were from diphtheria, 18 from typhoid and 8 from scarlet fever. Of the remain-ing, number there were about 20 re-turned as stillboru, which practically re-duces the total number to 88.
