The wheat market at Toronto on July 30th was 47,188 bush. against 34,097 bush. last year.

The visible supply in Canada and the United States is \$1,000 bush., against 388,000 bush. in 1893 and 377,000 bush. in 1892.

The market continues in a listless condition. Quotations continue weak with slight chance of improvement, as the growing crops everywhere are reported in a satisfactory condition.

The heavy rainfall and unsettled weather during the past week have been altogether favorable to the hop plantations in England. Mild is causing some anxiety, and the 8¢ bright has not entirely disappeared. A change to fine, bright weather will, however, soon improve matters again, and therefore prospects may be considered to continue generally good. Rather more business has been done in all kinds at the reduced currency.—*Licensing World*.
