## THE MOSAIC HISTORY OF CREATION, REVIEWED.

BVIOUS are the advantages of history, civil and ecclesiastical. It introduces us to the illustrious personages who flourished, and the great events which were accomplished, in the world and the church, in those remote ages of antiquity, with the occurrences which we must, otherwise, have been totally unacquainted.
