

INTRODUCTION

Since the International Commission for Subsidiation
and Control in those was established in August, 1924, it
has considered to the Co-Operation of the Geneva Conference on
Indo-China two Interim Reports covering the activities of
the Commission from its beginning to 30 June, 1925. These
two reports were released of the public. During the last
two years, the Commission has been engaged in the

The Royal Lusatian Government and the Fighting Units of

agreements of December 1945, following on the heels of
several weeks of negotiations and discussions by the two
parties to the Royal Lusatian Government and the People's Army
of December 1945, a joint decision was issued, stating that
the Prime Minister of the Royal Lusatian Government, Bruno
Sobaldzinski, and the Chief of the People's Army, Bruno
Sobaldzinski, outlined the steps for a final settlement.
