

COMMISSION  
ARTICLE II

The Commission shall possess in Canada juridical personality. It shall have the capacity:

- (a) to contract;
- (b) to acquire and dispose of property; and,
- (c) to institute legal proceedings.

ARTICLE III

The Commission, its property and its assets, wherever located and by whomsoever held, shall enjoy immunity from every form of judicial process except in so far as in any particular case the Executive Director of the Secretariat has expressly waived its immunity. Such waiver shall be understood not to extend to any measure of execution, save with the express consent of the Executive Director of the Secretariat. The Commission agrees to establish guidelines as to the circumstances in which the Executive Director may waive any immunity of the Commission, and as to the method in which any such waiver shall be made.

ARTICLE IV

The premises of the Commission shall be inviolable. The property and assets of the Commission, wherever located and by whomsoever held, shall be immune from search, requisition, confiscation, expropriation and any other form of interference, whether by executive, administrative, judicial, or legislative action, except with the consent of and under the conditions agreed to by the Executive Director of the Secretariat. This Article shall not prevent the reasonable application of fire protection regulations.

ARTICLE V

The archives and documents of the Commission shall be inviolable at any time wherever located.
