Also information as above in connection with the construction of a new wharf at Port Malcolm, Nova Scotia.

Mr. Stewart (Leeds), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 11th May, 1932, for a copy of all payrolls, bills, vouchers and other documents in respect of repairs to the Government Wharf at East River, Sheet Harbour, Halifax county, Nova Scotia, done in the fall of 1931, under William J. Chisholm as foreman.

By leave of the House, Mr. Hanson (York-Sunbury), seconded by Mr. Duff, moved,—That the Seventh and Final Report of the Select Standing Committee on Railways and Shipping owned, operated and controlled by the Government, be now concurred in.

After Debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The said Report was accordingly concurred in.

By leave of the House on motion of Mr. Casselman the recommendation contained in the Third Report of the Select Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines respecting the refund of \$204 in regard to Bill No. 33, An Act respecting the Montreal Central Terminal Company was concurred in.

By leave of the House on motion of Mr. Bennett it was resolved,—That this House shall meet at 11 o'clock, a.m., on Saturday the 21st instant, that there shall be an intermission from one to three o'clock, p.m., the Order of Business and procedure shall be the same as on Fridays and the House shall adjourn at six o'clock p.m.

The House went into Committee of the Whole to consider a proposed Resolution to amend the Civil Service Act.

## (In the Committee)

The following Resolution was adopted:-

Resolved, That it is expedient to amend the Civil Service Act, and to provide for the payment of gratuities to members of the Civil Service Commission on retirement, and to officers, clerks and employees in lieu of retiring leave.

Resolution to be reported.

The said Resolution was reported, read the second time and concurred in.

Mr. Cahan then, by leave of the House, presented a Bill, No. 99, An Act to amend the Civil Service Act, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The Bill No. 10, An Act to amend and consolidate the Fisheries Act, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with amendments, considered as amended, read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 73, An Act respecting the Incorporation of Live Stock Record Associations, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.
