Adjournment Debate

I would add that when the minister refers to "licensed fishermen", he is referring to the various provincial licensing requirements which prevail in inland waters.

With regard to the third point brought out by the hon. member, I think he is aware from comments made in the fisheries committee that a long time prior to the action we took against the United States commercial fishermen discussions had been taking place in the province of B.C. regarding the catch limit for tourists coming into B.C. and the amount of

canning that can be done by them. As he is also aware, that subject will continue to be examined, and I hope that an announcement will be made in the near future.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Ethier): Order, please. The motion to adjourn the House is now deemed to have been adopted. Accordingly, this House stands adjourned until two o'clock tomorrow afternoon.
