" reflrictions as are used in other colonies." And whereas it has graciously pleased your majetly, in the letters patents of com-' mission to your captain-general, and governour in chief, and in case of his death, or during his absence, in the letters patent of ' commission to your majesty's lieutenant-' governour of this province, to give and grant ' unto him full power and authority, with the advice and confent of your majesty's council, so soon as the situation and circum-· stances of this province would admit of it, and when and as often as need should re-' quire, to fummon and call general affemblies of the freeholders and planters, within this government, in such manner as he in ' his discretion should judge most proper. And whereas your petitioners, whose properties, real and personal, in this province, · are become very confiderable, having well · considered its present state and circumstan-· ces, and humbly conceiving them to be fuch ' as to admit the fummoning and calling a egeneral affembly of the freeholders and • planters; did, on the third day of December · last past, present their humble petition to ' the honourable Hector Theophilus Cramahé, Esq; your majesty's lieutenant-go-' vernour, and now commander in chief, flating as above, and humbly praying, that ' he would be pleased, with the advice and ' consent of your majesty's council, to sum-
