
OTTAWA, Oct. 20.—The following in-formation on the apple market has been received by the fruit division, depart-ment of agriculture: London, Eng.—Ribstons and Graven-steins selling at 3s to 10s. Prices for apples generally ruling low. Lake Ontario (north shore)—Very little fruit is going to waste. Practically all shipments are being exported and storing is very heavy. Prices are \$1.50 to \$2 f.o.b. Lake Huron Counties-Green varieties Lake Huron Counties—Green varieties going mostly to the evaporators. Some growers are refusing present prices and are storing fruit. Prices from the west and from the export market have been generally satisfactory. Georgian Bay District—There will be 10,000 barrels stored in Thornbury, and large quantities in Collingwood, Owen Sound and Meaford. Only spies, kings, baldwins, russets and similar varieties finding any sale.
