

and ten dollars (\$10) per week if treated in the public ward, provided, however, that if any patient shall remain in the Hospital for a period of five days or less, he or she shall be charged and be liable at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per day if treated in a private ward and two dollars (\$2.00) per day if treated in the public ward. Patients shall also be liable to pay for all drugs, medicines and serums other than such drugs, medicines and serums as are dispensed in ordinary hospital cases, and for all wines and spirituous liquors which may be used in their treatment. Any patient unable to pay medical fees shall be entitled to the free services of the Medical Officer in charge.

49. On admission into the Hospital every patient shall deposit all monies and articles of value in the hands of the Matron for safe keeping and deliver all baggage with the exception of such necessary clothing and other articles as may be required for immediate use, to the Matron.

50. Patients shall keep themselves clean and orderly and shall comport themselves decorously, quietly and in an orderly manner, and shall implicitly obey the medical officer and nurses.

51. Patients shall do all in their power to assist each other and shall, when able, give such assistance in the Hospital as may be required by the medical officer or Matron.

52. Patients shall not smoke in any of the wards, and shall not leave the Hospital without leave of the Medical Officer.

53. Any patient infringing any of the above regulations shall be liable to be discharged.

54. A copy of the regulations relating to patients and inmates shall be posted up in each ward or room of the Hospital.
