PUNCTUATION.

Punctuation is the art of dividing a written composition into sentences or parts of sentences by pauses which are required by the sense.

There are commonly reckoned four principal stops or signs.

The comma,	la virgula.
The semi-colon,	le point et virgule.
The colon,	les deux points.
The period,	le point final.

The comma.

The comma usually separates the parts of sentences which are closely connected in sense, but require a pause between them.

1º Two or more subjects relating to the same verb are separated by the comma.

Ex.: The husband, wife, and children were sick.

2º Two or more objects relating to the same verb.

Ex.: They sold their furniture, clothes, and stock.

3º Two or more adjectives qualifying the same noun.
