

# Porcupines Generally Easier, With Some Strong Spots Shown

## Hollinger at Ten Dollar Mark Mining Market is Irregular

Spent the Strong Feature of a Rather Mixed Session—Swatika Makes Recovery—Cobalt Quietly Steady.

World Office, Friday Evening, Nov. 10. Outside of a further slump in Hollinger, which carried the shares down to the ten-dollar mark, and another demonstration of strength in Vipond, there was little doing of interest in the local mining exchange today.

Trading was of only fairly active volume, but was pretty evenly distributed throughout the list, many of the usual extremely apathetic issues coming in for more than the accustomed volume of dealings.

The market at the opening of the session was inclined to sag, and in the first portion of the day the selling movement carried prices lower in a number of instances. After the overnight orders had been filled, the list slipped into extreme dullness, and at the close showed numerous recessions in prices of the most active issues.

The continued weakness in Hollinger was set down again as due to a bear raid upon the stock, but it was also aided by a selling movement which threw away their shares on the way down. No material volume of liquidation was evidenced, however, the demand being so slack that it required very little pressure to inculcate weakness. At the close, the stock was sold at \$10.00, and offerings had only two points higher.

Vipond was the redeeming feature of the whole list, the continuation of the strong buying demand of the last two days carried the shares up to \$14.00, a gain of over a point from last night. This immediate factor controlling the advance was the announcement that the coming report on the property would reflect highly upon its conditions, but the better the news was, the more the market was accumulating the stock of late had more to do with inspiring the buying movement.

Swatika was the only stock in the list showing a slight advance, the shares being sold at \$12.00, and offerings had only two points higher.

Belated Realizing Met. Belated realizing in some of the cheaper issues carried prices down to a slight extent. Preston, Crown Charter and Swatika, all suffering from the influence. The latter issue recovered sharply in the last dealing, however, selling up above \$30.00 again, after changing hands at \$27.00 in the day. Dime Extension sold at \$2.00, and the market was nothing particular doing in the Cobalt, and outside of a point rally in Timiskaming, which sold up to \$3.00, prices were unchanged.

Swatika, which had been showing a slight change from that current at mid-week, the general idea being that the market would be a little higher, and with the ultimate trend toward lower levels.

REPORT ON VIPOND. The directors of the Porcupine Gold Mines Co., more usually called the Vipond, will issue to the shareholders shortly a special report on the property, prepared by Mr. C. H. Porter, engineer in charge, who has just returned from a consulting engineer of the Rea. Mr. Porter is considered one of the ablest authorities on gold mining in the camp. The report, it is said, will be very favorable.

FREE GOLD IN LEVEL. Another free gold find has been reported from the northwest corner of Level Township, on some claims owned by A. Stull, of the township. The new free claims in the group and the free gold was found on one of these in an eight-foot vein that has been stripped about 500 feet.

BULLION SHIPMENTS. COBALT, Nov. 10.—Two bullion shipments have been sent out from the mines of the camp this week, the first being the usual shipment to the Crown Reserve. The townsite shipment consisted of three bars sent out from Campbell & Devell's plant, and the second from the mine, valued at \$10,000. The Crown Reserve shipments consisted of 17 bars, containing 24,000 ounces and valued at \$11,510.

GOOD NEWS FROM POME. Golden Starway Vein Demonstrated to Be 100 Feet Wide. SOUTH PORCUPINE, Nov. 10.—The Big Dome has made a discovery that surpasses anything that has yet been made in this camp. When the golden starway was first discovered, it was thought that it was a distinct vein a few feet wide and narrowing in the eastern extension of the Dome. On further development, the important fact was demonstrated that it was an enrichment in a vein fully one hundred feet wide.

Not getting down on what looked like the northern wall of this huge ore body, a shaft was sunk a hundred feet north of the golden starway. After going down a few feet of overburden, quartz was struck which for richness is paralleled only by the golden starway itself. It is now pointed beyond doubt that enormous enrichments exist both at the south and north in this body of ore, fully one hundred feet in width, and it is assumed that what has been developed into values that will cause a great sensation.

Not having reached the northern limit of this ore body, a shaft is being sunk another fifty feet further north. The whole field of ore is trending east with a slight northern bend, toward the Dome Extension. It is understood that the revelation of an ore body of such extent and richness came as a great surprise to the Dome management.

## OPTION TAKEN ON GILLES LAKE MINES WILL LOSE NO TIME IN GETTING DOWN TO WORK

Flynn's Porcupine May Get Control—Have Commenced Proving Up Property.

Porcupine, Nov. 8.—(From Our Man Up North.)—It is said that an option has been given on the control of the Gilles Lake Mines and already the flynners are operating drills in the ridge along the west bank of Gilles Lake.

The Gilles Lake Mines hold four claims at the west end of Gilles Lake, but no work has been done except that which was performed by Capt. Munn during the early days of Porcupine. Glacial drift lies very deep in places and as the rock cannot be seen it is difficult for engineers to line up the formation.

The present work is being done on the theory that the veins running east and west along the north side of Gilles Lake go thru under the lake bottom. A north and south vein is marked on the surface where it dips off to the west on the north side of the Hollinger Extension on the Gilles Lake property. The quartz comes to view along the lake shore, and the deposits are of a flinty character. Values were found in the quartz.

The work now being done will show up the true conditions, as engineers who have thoroughly inspected the camp state that there are evidences of a changed condition in this section, with Gilles Lake as the dividing line.

A junction of veins, it is pointed out, is not an impossible thing under the lake bottom where the Hollinger lead and the Pearl Lake veins appear to strike, near the west end of the camp. The east and west veins, they contend, may pass thru the lake bottom only to remain obscured with the heavy drift on the Gilles Lake property.

ROADBED IN GOOD SHAPE. Porcupine Looks for Thru Trains Soon—Wants Temporary Service. Porcupine, Nov. 8.—(From Our Man Up North.)—Thru trains, it is said, will be run into this camp, and the roadbed in good shape. The roadbed is in good shape, and the ballast spread to the Pearl Lake end.

At what is known as the Tisdale siding where the Dome branch cuts off to the south, while the main line runs to the west, a turn has been made by continuing the roadbed with the main line in the form of a "Y." Here the locomotives may be turned good shape the entire distance now with the exception of perhaps two miles to the west of the Dome siding.

The public is looking for gasoline motor car service between Golden City and the Pearl Lake end. Traffic is very heavy over the highway, and because of the stopping of the boats. It is pointed out that a gasoline motor car service, with a car making from three to four trips a day, would be a commodity of hundreds of persons. The venture would more than pay for the beginning, and if it did not the accommodation would be of great importance to warrant the running of a car at any rate.

No one really expects heavy trains to be run on the roadbed between the two points. A motor car service would fit the bill and satisfy the public. It is pointed out that some days 500 tons of material are hauled between Pearl and Porcupine lakes.

WILL RELAY ROADBED. KINGSTON, Nov. 10.—(Special.)—In order to run the drilling and crushing plant, the purpose of which is to grind at Granite quarry, two miles from the city, the Grand Trunk Railway has asked the city to furnish the company with 750 horse-power.

The company has decided to relay its roadbed from Toronto to Montreal with granite replacing cinders, but retaining the old of the dust. Mr. Burnell, chief electrician of the company, is here in regard to the matter.

NOT SELLING GOLD MINES. President Estates Denies Report That Negotiations Are On. MONTREAL, Nov. 10.—The president of the Gould Consolidated Mines takes exception to the rumormongering of a Toronto brokerage firm of the producing mines to take over the Gould properties.

Mr. Estes states that the directors would not entertain such a proposal, and that the company has been offered some time ago. The company, he says, has been fully financed for this year's work, and in view of the satisfactory results at the property, no attention was given to the idea.

SHORT MEASURE MILK. Complaints have reached the city medical health department to the effect that short measure milk is being sold in the city. It is said that cheap United States bottles which are not full measure are the cause.
