Here is something which helps to explain the glaring difference between the state of industry, commerce and social life on the opposite sides of the St. Lawrence, Niagara and Detroit Rivers. Wandering Yankees, who for the first time put foot on Canadian soil, have often marvelled that the width of a boundary stream should make all the difference between commercial activity and somnolence, between a policy of go-ahead and one of stick in the mud. But this despatch seems to furnish a clue to the mystery:

Ottawa, Ont. March 13.—The bill prohibiting the distribution and sale in Canada of newspapers issued or purporting to be issued on Sunday passed second reading in the Dominion House of Commons last night.

Public sentiment of the type indicated by that measure would stop the progress of any nation as efficiently as hobbles check the pace of a mustang. After Canada is done with Sunday newspapers it might stop Sunday railroad trains, and put a complete set of Connecticut blue laws through the Dominion Parliament.

The members of the Cabinet, on leaving the White House, said there was no special significance in the meeting.


