## Wharfage Dues

To be levied on all Merchandise, Animals and Things whatsoever Landed or shipped in the Harbour.
25 c . per Tou-All Goods, Wares and Merchandise not elsewhere specified.
20c. " " -Hay, Straw, Pig and Scrap Iron, Pot and Pearl Ashes.
15 c . " -Apples, Cratesand their contents, Flour and Meal, Fish, Meats
10c." " Pit'h, Potatoes, Tar, Horses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Swine.
$7 \frac{1}{2}$ e. " . -Coal and Coke, Grain and Seeds of all kinds.
Special....... Bricks, 10c. per 1,000; Cordwood, 5 c . per cord; Lumber, 10 c per 1,000 feet, board measure.
Free......... Bullion, Specie
On all Goods Wares and Merchandise whatsoever, the quantity of which by weight, ${ }^{1}$ asurement or other mode of estimate provided for in the Tariff, cannot b onvenieutly ascertained, it shall be lawful for the Harbour Commiss ers to levy a rate of $\frac{1}{}$ of 1 per cent, on the value thereof.
Each entry sh pay not less than 5 cents.
All property son on the wharves for re-shipment, shall only pay one wharfage.
The Ton mentioned in the Tariff of Wharfage dues shall be 2,000 lbs. veight, or 40 cubic feet measurement, according to the Bill of Lading.
