There was also a special grant made to the Rev. D. C. Moore of \$100; and to pay the expenses of the Rev. J. Woods for missionary work in the districts west of Halifax city, \$30—total \$2,187. The Executive Committee has lately made a grant of \$200 toward the support of a missionary at Melford, and voted the additional sum of \$100 to meet the same amount from the people on Digby neck. It is hoped that a clergyman may thus be supported there, although no help can be given from the Block sum of the S. P. G.

The people in the parishes receiving aid from the D. C. S. generally show their gratitude by larger returns to the Society, or by more active exertions for local objects.

From Albion Mines the contributions have steadily increased for some years past.

The people of Hubbard's Cove, though poor, are yet warm-hearted Churchmen, and the Missionary there has sent us a collection considerably larger than the former year.

The Rev. J. Breathing is working with zeal beyond his strength among the fishermen on the shores west of Halifax Harbor, visiting and teaching those who have been unavoidably left much without the ministrations of our Church.
