Vanderbilt's Sister-in-Law And Others of Social Elect Start Hegira to Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD, CAL.—Want to get into the movies, girls? Let's check over your qualifications. Have you one multimillionaire father, one good set of "cameras" features, and one famous name? Then you can walk right in. Among the social celebrities now drawing their \$500 a day as "extras" in the films are Craig Biddle, Jr., heir of the Philadelphia Biddle; Thelma Morgan Converse, daughter of Ambassador Harry Morgan and sister-in-law of Reginald Vanderbilt; and Miss Mary Hartie, of Philadelphia, heiress of the late Augustus Hartie.

Slaps Critic of Late President

Police Officer Cuffs Man For Slurring Remarks About Harding.

Auburn, Me., Aug. 6.—No one can speak disparagingly of the late President and get away with it in the presence of former Deputy Sheriff Elmer B. Lyon of Auburn. Lyon in commenting on the incident which resulted in the former deputy slapping the face of F. E. Russell, night watchman at the Munroe Shoe Company's plant.

"I was talking with a friend about the death of President Harding, when Russell, butted into the conversation and made slurring and uncalled for remarks about the late President," said Mr. Lyon. "I told him he ought to have his face slapped. He stuck his face out and invited me to slap it, and he got it slapped without any delay."

Mr. Lyon is now a special officer of the Auburn police department, and when Chief Harry Rowe heard of the incident he made a thorough investigation. Russell is said to have admitted to the chief that he made the remarks attributed to him and that he offered his cheek to be slapped. He had threatened to swear out a warrant against Special Officer Lyon, but so far has taken no action.

YOUTH HELD IN MURDER.

Denies Part in Slaying of Man Found on Pier.

New York, Aug. 8.—Charged with the murder of Frederick McElroy, John O'Sullivan, both of Brooklyn, was held without bail for further examination by Magistrate John J. Connelley in Tombs Court. O'Sullivan, who said he was secretary to the traffic manager of the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad, was arrested by Detective Pierce J. Fleming of the Old Ship Station following the discovery of McElroy's body early Saturday morning on a hand freight car on Pier 5, North River.

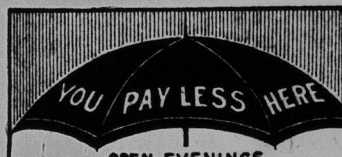
