### DEATHS

**Charles Newnam.**  
The death occurred at Broadmead, Devonshire, England, of Charles Newnam, Dec. 18, aged 73 years. Mr. Newnam took a prominent part in the public life of his community. In the recent Great War he served as a captain of the ordnance department and also saw service in the Egyptian campaign. His service in the army extended over 30 years and he was decorated with the Order of the British Empire. Mr. Newnam's wife died about twelve years ago. There are no children, but two brothers survive, of whom Archdeacon Newnam, of St. Stephen, is one.

**Mrs. Mary Killam Black.**  
Many old friends in this city will learn with regret of the death of Mrs. Mary Killam Black, widow of William Black, who was connected with the shipping business in this city for many years. A long time ago he was

a member of the firm of Glasgow & Black. Mrs. Black, who as a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Killam, Yarmouth, N.S., died at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Crone, Amsterdam, Holland, on Jan. 15, after a lingering illness. Besides her daughter she leaves one son, S. W. Black, of Milton, Ont., and three nieces, Miss Pauline Biederman, of this city; Miss Stephens, Somerville, Mass., and Miss Clara Calk, Yarmouth, to mourn.

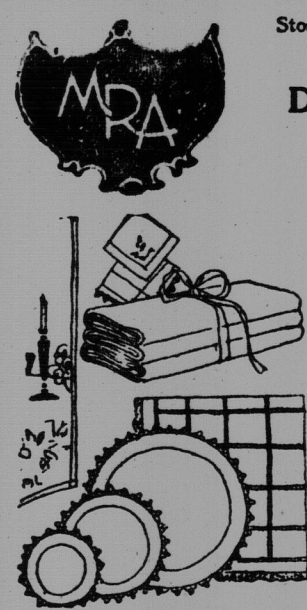
