City and C. P. R. to Request Conveyors and Breakwater be Built

CLAIMS TO HAVE KILLED A MAN

Girl in Reformatory Tells Weird Story, Fails to Find Grave.

Bridgeton, N. J., Feb. 12.—County officials tramped for hours through the rain in the woods between Vineland and Newfield in company with Alice Barton, 19 years old, an inmate of the State reformatory at Clinton, in a search for the grave of a man she is alleged to have said she murdered in the woods several months ago.

The girl was unable to find the spot, she told Prosecutor Roscoe Ward. When it became dark the girl was taken back to the home by Warden A. T. Ashman, to whom she told her strange story. Authorities are confining the investigation.

The girl was arrested on a charge of disorderly conduct in Vineland several months ago, pleaded guilty and was sent to the Cumberland County jail at Bridgeton. From there, a month ago, she was transferred to the State reformatory at Clinton, in a search for the grave of a man she is alleged to have said she murdered in the woods several months ago.

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NEGROES DEFRAUD BANKS IN 15 CITIES

Caught by Buffalo Detectives at Work at Cashier's Window.

New York, Feb. 12.—A new manner of defrauding banks is revealed in an arrest in Buffalo of two negroes after a year's successful operations in about fifteen cities. According to the American Bankers' Association, who maintain a nation-wide bank crook trap, elaborate supplies of materials, used in swindling banks, were taken from the prisoners.

How effectively banks are co-operating to combat criminals through the extended protective department of the Bankers' Association was illustrated in the suddenness of their capture in the midst of perpetrating a crime.

The two negroes, according to the Bankers' Association, began operations in Buffalo on Jan. 17. One of them appeared at the special savings account window of a bank and presented a counter check on the bank for \$75.00.

He also presented a second deposit slip for \$3, accompanied by \$3 in cash. He said he wanted to deposit the \$3 in cash and the balance of the \$200.00 to the credit of his wife, but had forgotten to bring her book and would return with it later. His check and book were accepted, totaling \$78.00.

With the two deposits totaling \$81.00, he and his partner fled. The two negroes admitted their guilt. The Bankers' Association said, and in their rooms were found many checks, deposit slips and pass books.

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VOCATIONAL WORK DISCUSSION

Erection of School Here Depends on Government Approval.

Local action in the matter of establishing vocational education in St. John was held up pending the action of the New Brunswick Board of Education, it was explained at last night's meeting of the Board of School Trustees.

W. Crawford, Dominion director of technical education, wrote offering any assistance in the establishing of vocational education in St. John. The letter was referred to the vocational committee when appointed. Judge McKeown explained that the New Brunswick Board of Education had not yet signified its assent to the plans of the St. John school board in this matter.

The Provincial Vocational Board, which expressed approval of these plans but the approval of the Board of Education had not yet been obtained. This was necessary before a vocational committee could be named.

Mr. Day thought it was an objectionable feature of the Vocational Education Act that it placed the appointment and supervision of teachers with the vocational committee and not with the school board although the board paid the salaries.

Hon. H. A. McKeown, the chairman, presided. Others present were Trustees Mrs. E. R. Taylor, G. H. Green, H. A. Porter, A. A. McIntyre, H. G. Smith, Thomas Nagle, E. R. W. Ingraham, George E. Day and S. A. Worrell, acting superintendent, and A. Gordon, secretary.

Gifts of 40 dumbbells and an electric lantern for Albert school from the Carleton W. C. T. U. and a piano for the Centennial school from the Centennial school were referred to the trustees.

The Municipal Chapter, I. O. D. E. sent an offer to provide prizes for the students of the school. The offer was referred to the trustees.

Madame Justice LeMay's offer to instruct the teachers in new methods of teaching French was referred to a special committee.

Applications for positions on the teaching staff were received from Misses Kathleen B. McArthur and Muriel E. Thompson and Mary E. Munde, West Branch, Kent county.

The offer of Loyalist Chapter, I. O. D. E. to place war memorial pictures in the school was referred to the trustees.

The request of the High School Alumnae for the use of the High School assembly hall for the presentation of a play was referred to the trustees.

George E. Day was warmly welcomed by his fellow trustees, after a lengthy illness and he thanked the members of the Board for their kind attentions while confined to the house.

Much Sickness A great deal of sickness among the school children was shown by the report of the secretary which showed that during the month there had been 18 cases of scarlet fever, 12 of diphtheria, three of chicken pox and one of measles reported to the teachers. The trustee officer reported 10 truant and 74 irregulars. The enrollment for the month was 8,688 and the attendance percentage was 93.39.

HARRY CLARK IS FREED FROM JAIL

Fredericton, Feb. 11.—Harry Clark of this city, serving a sentence of six months for theft, was released today from the York county jail on parole.
