DEATH CLAIMS A

PROMINENT CITIZEN

William Shaw, former M.P.P. for St. John city, passed quietly to rest last evening at his residence, 137 Waterloo street, in his eighty-fourth year. Mr. Shaw's death was not unexpected as he had received a sudden shock when he accidentally fell very heavily in the office of his bakery last Saturday evening. His condition since then has been precarious and little hope was held out for recovery. The late Mr. Shaw was a citizen with wide interests in, the welfare of his fellowmen, having served the fare of his fellowmen, having served the public in the political arena for many years, first as alderman and then as member of the legislature. Due to advancing age, he had not taken such a leading part in public affairs in late years. He is survived by five sons, one daughter, nine grandchildren and the sons are: William E.,and Allan B., at home; Edwin E., Sydney (N. S.); Leonard D., Montreal, and Harrison B., Washington (D.C.) The funeral will be held on Monday at 2.30 p.m. from his late residence.

The late Mr. Shaw was born in the parish of Simonds, St. John county, on September 19, 1838, his parents being William and Ellen (West) Shaw. His father, who was a native of the north of Ireland, emigrated to New Brunswick about the year 1825 and engaged here in agricultural pursuits.



Allan Arthurs and Mrs. Donald McGillivray, convenors of sub-committees.


