WHY THIS EXCITEMENT?

cent. the amount of estimated lumber in the logs cut. It is possible that in other parts of Canada the bonus paid by the lumbermen in addition to stumpage dues makes up for this loss in scaling. But, other things being equal, lumbermen operating under a lenient rule have an unfair advantage over those whose logs are more closely scaled and the only final remedy would seem to be the adoption of a general rule such as the International, or, better still, the substitution of cubic measurement of logs, a practice which has long been in operation in Europe where high lumber prices make accuracy not only desirable but necessary.

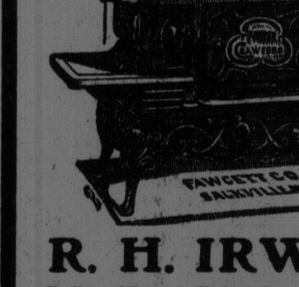
