## ALBANI TELLS HER LIFE STORY

### Canadian Song Queen's "Forty Years of Song" Issued—How Her Stage Name Was Chosen—Owed Much to Musical Father

A few days ago Madame Albani's "Forty Years of Song" was issued, and it is not likely to be forgotten. The young artist had lived for some time in Albany the name seemed to be a happy one and she adopted it.

Her musical and dramatic gifts were discovered early by her father, a French-Canadian with music in his soul, who played and taught on the organ, the violin, the harp and the piano. The family lived at Chambly, near Montreal, and it was here that Emma was born on November 1, 1892. She began her musical studies when she was five years old, and often studied for hours a day.

From one of her aunts she had her first instruction in the dramatic arts, and Mme. Albani relates that one day she took the part of an "imp" in a school play with such dexterity that she astonished the good sisters and the rest of the audience. The more the delighted spectators applauded, the more thoroughly she threw herself into the part, until at length she became hysterical and had to be carried away. She was still a young girl when she went to Paris and studied under the famous tenor Duprez. Then she went to Milan, where she became the pupil of Lamperti, whom she holds to have been the greatest voice producer in the world.

### A Leap to Fame

On one occasion she sang for Prince Poniatowski, the noted critic, who admired her voice but remarked, "Her voice is not correct." "Ah!" replied Lamperti, "that will be all right. She is like a bottle of soda water; I have only to draw the cork, and out it comes." Mme. Albani's debut was made at Messina in the part of "La Sonnambula," and it was a tremendous triumph for her. Next she sang at Malta, where she made many friends. Her English premier was in Covent Garden, on April 2, 1872, and again she chose "La Sonnambula." Her success was even greater than at Messina, and her fame was established at a bound. She was then under the management of Frederick Gye, who soon afterwards became her husband. At the festival in Birmingham she won further laurels and was placed on the same plane as Patti. Among her warmest admirers was Queen Victoria, who became not only her patron, but her friend. The Queen delighted in music of every school, but loved the Scotch songs best. She never tired, says Mme. Albani, of listening to "The Bluebirds of Scotland," "Annie Laurie," and "Within a Mile of Edinburgh Town."

### A Curious Incident

In the world tour she made Mme. Albani met many odd people and was involved in many curious incidents. One of the latter is worth repeating. It happened in Mexico, where she was singing in "Otello," and a bed had to be provided for her death agonies, placed upon three steps on a platform. The bed and platform were produced, but at the last moment no steps could be found. The ingenious stage manager solved the difficulty by placing the bed on the stalwart backs of three stage hands, who supported the structure while Desdemona was smothered by Otello. The "supers" proved equal to the task, and Mme. Albani never perished more comfortably than on that occasion.
