

APPROVAL OF DEMPSEY-TUNNEY FIGHT EXPECTED NEXT WEEK

TUNNEY GIVEN LICENSE BUT NOT DEMPSEY

State Athletic Commission to Hold Special Meeting to Decide Matter

NEW YORK, Aug. 11.—Red tape blocking the proposed Dempsey-Tunney championship bout, September 16, probably will be cut by a special meeting of the State Athletic Commission next week. Opinion today leaned to the theory that a special meeting would from out the formalities and pave the way for final approval.

With Dempsey and Tunney applying in person for licenses to box in New York State, the license committee yesterday pondered the issues so carefully that a three hour session was necessary. When the smoke cleared it was found that Tunney's license had been approved. Dempsey's application was "deferred" until he shall have complied with the rules of the commission, but reviews and interpretations made this ruling appear less harsh than at first indicated.

St. Stephen Players Win From Milltown

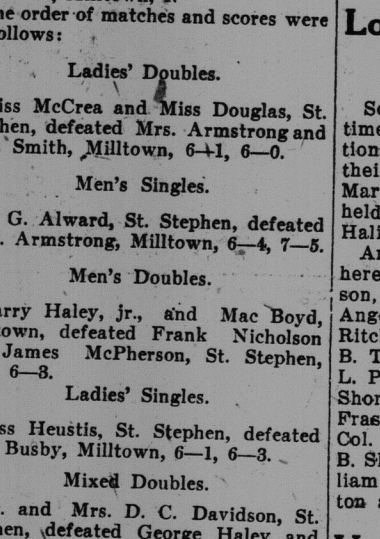
