"I am the regular driver of Q.1 W.P. No CM4202187, a Ford station wagon which is the Regimental Quartermaster's vehicle. On Sep 3, 1942, at about 1800 hrs I was called by Mr Knox and on his instructions, drove him to Brighton. At around midnight after having looked for Mr. Knox without finding him, I got in the station wagon and drove back to camp arriving there at about 0200 hrs 4 Sep 42. As soon as I returned to camp, Mr. Maw ordered me to take him to Brighton. At Brighton we drove to the Military Police Headquarters. Shortly after arriving there Mr. Knox and Mr. Maw came out of the building and got into the vehicle. From there we drove back to camp. We arrived at Camp at about 0530 hrs or perhaps a little later."
