## **THREATENED ON** MARKET

New York, Aug. 18.—For the first time this week today's stock market evinced a reactionary tendency, with a generally lower level of prices. In no instance were the declines serious, nor was there any evidence of en-fored liquidation, but rather of realiz-ing for profits with some attendant bear selling. The day's budget of news was not especially illuminating, although the general belief is that the political clouds are tooming large over the financial horizon and the events of the next few weeks are bound to leave their impression on the securi-tics markets.
