AN OVER-NIGHT GAIN OF FIFTY POINTS FOR BETHELEHEM STEEL

Yesterday's dealings indicate public is participating in speculative mania—War Specialties recovered five to ten points over final quotations of Wednesday's session.

New York, Oct. 7.—The inference in a class by itself, rose to 450, an overnight gain of fifty points, and Bethlehem Steel advanced 2 1/4 to 47 1/2. Anaconda Copper came forward with an advance of 3 3/4 to 75 5/8 in the final hour, the whole list regaining its vigor of the early session, and closing with a vast majority of net gains. Total sales were 1,500,000 shares. Recoveries of five to ten points from yesterday's final quotations, and of ten to fifteen from the minimum of the day, were registered by the movement were Crucible Steel, Baldwin Locomotive, Westinghouse, and Colorado Fuel, while Motors and some less distinctive stocks made equal headway. Pittsburgh Coal, common and preferred, Philadelphia Company and the United Railways system shared to a substantial degree, as did American Beet Sugar, on the proposed repeal of the free sugar tariff act. The government report, showing an improved condition and indicating higher yield for corn, with higher estimates for spring and winter wheat, bore out all known conditions regarding the crop outlook. Some sensational issues were made for by Copper convertible issues, with general strength in the bond market. Total sales, par value, \$5,540,000.
