**OTTAWA WON BY
SUPERIOR TEAM PLAY**
Defeated Canadiens by Score
of Three to One—Fast
Clean Game Throughout.

Quebec, Feb. 27.—Quebec saw a
regular National Hockey League
game here tonight, Ottawa trimming
Canadiens by three goals to one be-
fore a fair sized house, the majority
of which were supporters of the local
club in view of the fact that
Malone, Hall and McDonald, Quebec
players figure with the Frenchmen.
Ottawa won by superior team play
aided by superb goal tending by
Clint Benedict, who earned hearty
applause from the crowd in the third
period by his sensational work. It
was a clean game, not a penalty he-
ing inflicted, though Hall might have
been handed one for a savage check
which he handed out to Nighbor early
in the game. Malone was watched
too closely to be effective, the Ottawa
defence being unbreakable. Canadiens
scored first, LaLonde netting on
Corbeau's pass, but it proved to be
their last, Nighbor scoring twice be-
fore the first twenty minutes, and
second period was the fastest and
play was evenly divided. Bucher, how-
ever, scoring for Ottawa after Nigh-
bor had worked the rubber in and
passed out. There was no score in
the third twenty, thanks to Benedict.
