## Cleared for Africa.

## The Furness Line

The Furness Line Kanawha, which  
left Halifax December 31, entered  
port yesterday. She is docked at No.  
2 berth and is taking on a general  
cargo for a British port. She is from  
Thomson & Co.

## New Schooner, Coming

Among the schooners expected in  
this port is the schooner George Mel-  
ville Cochrane. This vessel was  
launched last Tuesday at Port Gran-  
ville, N. S., and has been purchased  
by Adam B. McKay. She will come  
here to load lumber for a southern  
port.

## A Total Loss

Stavanger, Dec. 29—S.S. Texas  
from Halifax, November 29, for Got-  
tenburg which was reported ashore  
December 10 near the Lister light-  
house off the northwest coast of Ger-  
many, is breaking up on account of a  
storm and will be a total loss. She  
is of 3,953 tons gross and was owned  
in Gotthenburg.

## The Manchester Line.

The schooner Prout, 175 tons, Cap-  
tain Hagan, which left this port on  
December 12th for Port Natal, South  
Africa, has put into Bermuda leaking  
badly. She is registered at Durban,  
S. A., and carried a general cargo.  
Wm. Thomson & Co. are the local  
agents.

## A Total Loss

Schooner Fred B. Beland, hence for  
Windsor, N.S., with 400 tons of fer-  
tilizer, is a total loss at Great Bass  
Island, near Jonesport, crew saved.

## Old Barge Destroyed.

Beaumont, Tex., Dec. 31—Fire fol-  
lowing an explosion attributed to spon-  
taneous combustion virtually de-  
stroyed the oil barge Lynn and 7,000 bar-  
rels of crude petroleum yesterday.  
The loss is \$250,000.

## CHANGE OF TIME.

Slight Time Changes on Canadian  
Government Railways Effective  
January 5th, 1919.  
Changes of time schedules on C. G.  
R. lines effective January 5th will  
not effect, to any extent, the train  
service out of St. John. The only  
change in departing time is that of  
10 A.M. express which will leave at 2:05  
p.m. five minutes earlier than at pres-  
ent. There will be no change on the  
time of trains arriving except that  
Suburban No. 332 leaving Hampton at  
1:40 p.m. will arrive in St. John at  
2:25 p.m. ten minutes earlier.

## FIRE DESTROYS LARGE ELEVATOR

Port William, Ont., Jan. 2.—Fire  
destroyed the 100,000 bushel elevating  
elevator of Parrish and Heimbecker  
today. The alarm came at 11:45 a.m.,  
and by two o'clock the frame building  
was leveled, the whole structure col-  
lapsing with a crash. Several houses  
nearby were threatened, and even  
caught fire, but the blaze was kept in  
control. The loss is estimated at  
\$250,000 on the buildings.
