The Honorable Mr. Ryan moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Ferrier,

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying His Excellency to cause to be laid before this House copies of all correspondence between the Governments of Great Britain and Canada on the subject of an address of this House to His Excellency the Governor General, adopted on the 15th May, 1868, praying that, with Her Majesty's consent, Canadian reprints of British copyright works may be placed on the same footing as Foreign reprints, in this Dominion.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative and it was

Ordered, That such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council do wait on His Excellency the Governor General with the said Address.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by the Honorable Sir Vohn A. Macdonald and others, in the following words:

House of Commons, Monday, 19th April, 1869.

Resolved, That a Message be sent to the Senate informing their Honors that this House has appointed the Hon. Sir George E. Cartier, Baronet, Honorable Messrs. J. S. Macdonald, McDougall, Gray, Dorion, Smith, Blanchet, Tupper, Messrs. Morris, Chamberlin and Mills, to assist Mr. Speaker in the direction of the Library of Parliament, so far as the interests of this House are concerned, and to act as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the Library.
