

Holding nine cards in the same suit the drop play is favoured over a finesse. Holding A, K, 10, 8, 7, 4 in your hand and J, 9 in dummy the best play in order to avoid losing a trick in the suit is to lead the J and finesse. Holding K, 10, 9, 4, 2 in your hand and A, 8, 7, 3 in dummy the percentages favour playing for the cards to split and fall on A, K. However should an honour fall on the first round if possible finesse against the other opponent of the second round.
