These you will
be pleased again to notify
to them in the strongest
manner, and with the energy
which the accompanying
documents containing them,
so pointedly evince.

Have
then to request you to report
without delay, for His Honor's
information, what effect is
produced by the communication,
and how the Indians are
disposed, in order that His
Honor may lose no time in
obtaining, from His Excellency
the Governor in Chief, such
further instructions as the
result may then be necessary.
