Reference your #142-1-5 dated September 14th, 1938.

Sir:-

On behalf of the Indians of Moose Woods Reserve,  
Whitecap Sioux Band, I hereby make application to graze 100 head  
of cattle and 20 horses, the property of the said Indians, on the  
following lands:-

N<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Section 8, All 7 & 8, NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-9, SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-10, All 17 & 18, S<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-19,  
All 20, in Township 34, Range 5, West of the 3rd Meridian.

These lands are fenced, the fence having been created  
by the Indians at their own expense.

Our grazing land on the Indian Reserve is very limited  
and not sufficient for our needs.

I beg to ask that, as in the past, permission be granted  
the Indians to graze their stock on the above mentioned lands,  
free of charge.
