The gate does not enter from the side of the Summer Resorts but from the road, and there can be no objection to it. I did not have time to call for tenders for the material required for the fence but dealt with L.M. Poole & Co who furnished material previously. I had very little time to attend to the matter for I spent one whole day in Charlottetown before I could get across as the ice was packed in the harbour. Then the next day I got across in the p morning and the ice backed into the harbour and I could not get back to the city till it was a late in the evening and the places of business were about to close. The delay caused by the ice also explains why the expenses of the trip was larger than I anticipated.
