
I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th instant, stating that the Manager of the Union Bank at Warton is desirous that the pay cheques of the Cape Croker Indians should be cashed at his Bank.

In reply I may inform you that this Department does not control such a matter; the credit for the purpose of paying the Indians is placed with the Bank of Montreal here, and the Department pays the Indians by cheques on that credit. If any change is made it would have to be effected through the Finance Department.
