Has CQMS Boyer appeared before you for any interviews?

Yes.

And approximately how many times has he come before you for interview?

Well, I saw him here for interview on the 1st of March for the first time.

That was the first interview you had?

No, No, I saw him othe times. I saw him in the office of Capt Lafleur this was previous to him proceeding on course, this Winter Warfare Course and I probably saw him once in 1949. I also saw him on my liaison visit through the Eastern townships in about September.
