Q. Where did you meet and discuss this matter with the Agent?

A. We met the Agent both here and at the Cannery.

DR. MCKENNA: How many of you met the Agent here and talked this matter over with him.

A. Four of us: Andrew Smith, Billy Hall, Sam of the Cannery, and another man.

Q. How many were at the meeting at the Cannery?

A. I don't know.

MR. YOUNG: Were there ever any Indians who told you that they did not want to leave this place and go to Crab River.

A. In the winter time all the Indians want to go to Crab River.

THE CHAIRMAN: Robert Nelson is the second Chief of your tribe is he not?

A. He is the Interpreter for the Chief.

Q. He knows pretty well what is going on amongst the Indians, does he not? What they want and what they don't want?

A. He hears what the Indians say about everything.

Q. And he knows what they want and what they don't want, pretty well?

A. Yes, he understands.

Q. Robert Nelson and Johnny Paul said something different to what you are saying about the tide overflowing your houses and gardens.

They said it did not interfere with or trouble the houses or gardens.

A. The water does not come up to Robert Nelson's house or Johnny Paul's house either.

MR. YOUNG: Are there any watermarks on your new house?

A. Yes, there are watermarks on the posts of the new house.

BILLY HALL was then sworn and examined, by Mr. YOUNG.

Q. Do you live here on this Reserve?

A. Yes.

Q. Point out where the high tides come on this Reserve?

A. If I did not know anything about this Reserve, I would not say anything about it. I have lived here since I was a young man and I know what I am saying. The water comes on to this side of my house and on towards the Church.

Q. How close to the Church?

A. Well to the house just behind the Totem pole (indicating)
