

Astrophysical Observatory on Observatory Hill (formerly Little Saanich Mountain) was in 1918 completed. Visitors should not fail to see this great seat of scientific research. Dr. J. S. Plaskett is the director.

The site for this Observatory was selected by the Government because of Victoria's unequalled climate and the low range of temperature. It commands one of the finest views on the Pacific Coast.
