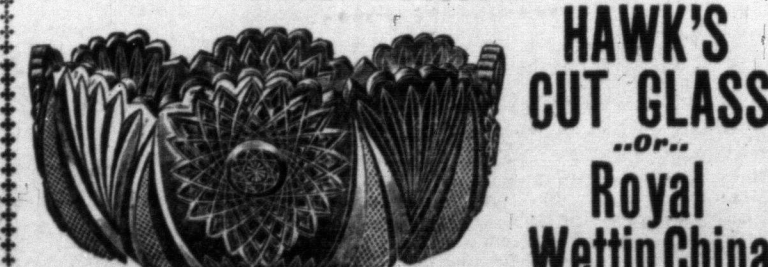

PURE MILK.

"While in London the other day," said J. A. Wilson, the Queen street grocer, "I noticed the milk system, which is so far ahead of our own here. The milk is bought by the company, which supplies it to the people, and is just put through a cooling process, which takes all the animal heat out of it, then it is clarified, after which it is either pasteurized or sterilized. The people can have this pure milk delivered to them the same day as it is brought in to the company at 5 cents per quart, while we here pay 3 cents per quart for what goes through none of these processes."

"I do not see why we cannot have this done here in Chatham, certainly pay and I think all will agree with me in saying that it ought to be done."
