

PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS by Our Proclamations made and issued under the Great Seal of Our Island of Newfoundland, and bearing date respectively the Twelfth and Thirteenth of March last past, and the Sixth of this present month, We have, among other things, directed and appointed the places within the several Electoral Districts at which the Elections of Members to serve in the General Assemly for the said Districts shall be holden: And Whereas We deem it expedient to direct and appoint that an additional Polling Place shall be established within the Electoral District of Burin:

Now know Ye that We do, by this Our Proclamation, direct and appoint that there shall be Two Booths established at Burin, within the aforesaid Electoral Districts of Burin, instead One Booth, as provided for by the Proclamation bearing date the Thirteenth day of March aforesaid.

Given under the Great Seal of Our Island of Newfoundland, at Saint John's, in Our said Island, the Seventeenth day of April, 1861, in the Twenty-fourth Year of Our Reign.

Witness Our trusty and well-beloved Sir Alexander Banner-Man, Knight, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our said Island and its Dependencies, &c.
