> BOSTON, May 24 -- District Attorney Hill concurring in the plea of the counsel for the defense in extenuation of the actions of Murdoch C. MacGregor and Roderick C. McKenzie, attendants at the Pierce farm insane asylum, who came up for sentence today following their conviction for manslaughter in having caused the death of Richard A. Mitchell, Judge Schofield dealt with them leniently. MacGregor was sentenced to three years, and MacKenzie to two years and one-half in the house of correction. The discrepancy in sentence was due to the fact that Mac-Gregor was MacKenzie's superior and partly responsible for the latter's ac-

MacKenzie was an inmate of Pierce farm. He died from injuries alleged to have been received on March 18. while closeted alone with the two defendants. He, MacKenzie, originally came from Prince Edward Island, while MacGre-


