RIGID SCRUTINY NEEDED.

A short time ago the St. Thomas Journal attempted to defend Premier Laurier against the charges of graft and wrong doing in the different departments of his Government, which have been made by the Conservative members of Parliament and which were commented upon in The Planet. The reply from this journal has brought forth the following comment from the St. Thomas paper:

"As regards the alleged wrong doings of Government officials we are prepared to await the result of the investigation which has been ordered. No anxiety is felt so far as the Government is concerned. It's record is clean, and if there have been wrongdoings on the part of those entrusted with important public missions. The Planet can rest assured that the guilty ones will be punished, and not shielded as has been customary in cases where Conservative officials have betrayed their party. In conducting the affairs of state an army of servants is employed and it ought not to cause great consternation should a black sheep be found in the fold. However, nothing has been revealed as yet, and we shall continue to believe the accused innocent until proven guilty."

The St. Thomas Journal should have gone further, and in all fairness to the accused and the accusers, they should have stated that full and free inquiry into these charges is to say the least imperative. It has been shown that the investigation" spoken of by the Journal is by no means one that will satisfy fair minded citizens, and if there have been "wrong doings" by a number of "black sheep" why are the offenders shielded by the Government? The Government is held responsible for the actions of its servants and Sir Wilfrid is making himself doubly liable for these acts of injustice by refusing to grant

a sweeping inquiry. The men who occupy the Opposition benches at Ottawa are by no means the rogues that the Journal man would like to make out. They are honest men with the welfare of this country at heart, and elected to do all in their power to forward its interests. They are upheld by honest and fair-minded Liberals as well as by Conservatives when they call for a complete investigation into any department where there is any suspicion of graft and dishonesty.


