SOME HOPE YET.

The decision of the Government in selecting Stratford instead of Chatham as the site for the new Normal School has been to cause of much disappointment and regret among the many citizens who worked so earnestly in their efforts to secure this school for the Maple City. The powers at Toronto considered that the Classic City was better situated to accommodate the district which it was the intention to cover. Chatham's case was ably supported, and there can be no regret on that score, as every possible advantage offered by Chatham was brought before the attention of the Government.

All hope is not yet lost, however. The announcement is made that it is the intention of the Government to establish more Normal Schools as soon as the finances of the country will permit. It is almost an assured fact that Chatham will figure as one of the lucky cities when that time comes.

The Stratford Herald, in a recent editorial commenting on this subject, in answer to an article in the London Advertiser, has the following to say:—

"The London Advertiser says:— 'That the choice of sites for the four Normal Schools has been determined by party reasons is very patent. Stratford is too near London. Chatham had the better claim.' Stratford is 47 miles from London, Chatham 55, so that Stratford is only 18 miles nearer to London than Chatham. The Advertiser would have two Normal school sites in Southwestern Ontario and none in the Northwestern portion. This is its idea of a fair geographical distribution. If there were a Normal school located at Chatham and none at Stratford, the students would still have to choose between going to Toronto or to London, and probably be obliged to accept the latter alternative, as Toronto has enough territory to draw from nearer home. The distance from Owen Sound to London is 156 miles. It would evidently suit the Advertiser to have London at one side of the territory from which it would draw Normal school students. There is no need of its being envious of Stratford. London Normal school, under the new regulations, which will practically abolish Model schools, will have plenty of students, and if the Advertiser were not animated by a party spirit it would have the fairness to acknowledge that in choosing Stratford the Government made a good selection. Some of the strongest Liberals in Stratford and district have been active in promoting the selection of Stratford."

#### A DISGRACEFUL RECORD.

The session of the Dominion Parliament recently closed will long be remembered for other things, more than for any legislation accomplished. It was a year of exposure. More scandals have been brought to light during this session than in any other since the union of the Provinces. From early in March until July Opposition members have steadily and persistently prosecuted enquiry into the expenditure of public money, the management of the public domain, and into charges of plunder and graft in public business. No session of Canadian parliamentary history has seen more faithful work been done in committees of investigation. The enquiries have been pressed in the face of many difficulties. Documents have been delayed or withheld. Witnesses have refused to answer questions and have been supported in their refusal by ministers and Government majorities. Investigation into several transactions has been balked, sometimes indirectly and two or three times by a direct vote of the House, where a party majority refused to allow the enquiry. Nevertheless the record is long and ghastly.

## CATTLE IMRURE

Dundee Advertiser Says Emerald Isle Should Not Throw Stones.

London, July 20.—The Dundee Advertiser quotes a statement of Robert Houston, secretary of the Armagh agricultural technical instruction committee, to the effect that in eight years he has subjected over 200 Irish cattle to the tuberculosis test. One hundred and sixty-four failed in the test.

The paper says those who live in glass houses should not throw stones. The Irish should be the last to cast imputations on the purity of Canadian cattle, yet with Canadian and other supplies stopped, upon Ireland Britain would have to depend for her stores.

#### Home Rule For Scotland.

London, July 20.—Irritated by the lack of opportunities to discuss Scottish questions in the House of Commons and somewhat jealous of the promises of greater control of local affairs made to Ireland in the King's speech at the opening of Parliament, the Scottish members have elected Mr. Birrie, Liberal member for the North Division of Aberdeen, to introduce a bill providing for the establishment of a Parliament for Scotland. The project is not taken seriously. There is no demand among the people of Scotland for a local Parliament.

#### Dreyfus Remembers Zola.

Paris, July 20.—There was a demonstration yesterday at the tomb of Emile Zola, commemorative of the acquittal of Dreyfus. The latter sent a wreath of roses and orchids bearing his card. A large crowd and many policemen were present, but there was no disorder. Major Dreyfus was recognized among the gathering and was greeted with a perfect ovation.

Gen. Picquart, the champion of Major Dreyfus, yesterday paid a ceremonial visit to President Fallieres, after taking up his appointment as brigadier-general.

#### Bees as Ventilators.

It is not generally known, but most beekeepers will inform you that such is the case, that each beehive has a corps of what could properly be termed "ventilating bees." During the hot seasons these ventilators station themselves at the entrance of the hive and fan the interior with the incessant motion of their wings. These ventilating corps are usually in relays of from four to a half dozen, and they are relieved at short intervals by fresh workers who keep up the fanning process. They are kept at work by a sort of patrol of bees, which insures incessant activity on the part of the fanners during the time they are at work. This story may sound strange to those who know but little concerning the wonderful intelligence of bees, but it is a scientific fact that has often been authenticated.

#### Diet and Sickness.

It is a broad rule that boiled milk and puddings made with milk agree more frequently than anything to restore a sick person. When beginning to restore a sick person to more ordinary diet begin with white fish, boiled. Place or sole boiled in milk is excellent. Never give potatoes when the digestion is bad. In place of bread give toast. Often there is a craving for acids. In such cases give lemon juice diluted with water and sweetened with sugar when allowable or with saccharin in diabetes.
