Another Lake Disaster.

PORBY ARTHUR, Ont., Dec. 17.—The schooner Mary Ann Hulbert, which was being towed to Michipicoten by the steamer Kincardine, founded off St. Ignace Island on Friday night. The Hulbert carried a crew of five, in addition to fifteen laborers, all of whom were saved with the vessel. The Kincardine arrived at Paps Point at 2 o'clock Saturday morning, and reported that a terrific storm came on very suddenly. The steamer's officers held on to the vessel as long as they possibly could, but finally decided to cut her loose to save themselves, the vessel being full of water and in a sinking condition. A few moments after they parted the Hulbert was seen to give a terrible lurch and go down with all on board. Those on the steamer were unable to render any assistance or attempt a rescue on account of the hurricane and the heavy seas running at the time. Boats were loaded with supplies from Port Arthur, and consigned to railway contractors at Michipicoten.
