The fire alarm system is now in complete working order throughout the city. Chief Davidson is desirous that all citizens make themselves familiar with the location of the boxes nearest their residences in order that there may be no delay in case of fire.

He also requests that the fire alarms be used in preference to telephones in sending in calls for fire, as the brigade are thus able to respond more quickly.

As a result of a quarrel over a democrat at the Castle Livery barn on Second street, George Hay, a Dominion Land Guide, is awaiting trial in the Supreme Court on a charge of assault and attempting to stab. The complainant is W. L. Young and the alleged offence was committed on Monday afternoon. The preliminary hearing took place yesterday before Magistrate Wilson and the committal for trial was the result. At the hearing the prosecutor conducted his own case and the defendant was represented by Mr. Allison of Griesbach, O'Connor and Allison.

W. L. Young, who is foreman at the Castle Livery, testified that on Monday afternoon he was at the barn. There was a horse-stealer named Hay in the yard which he had been told to hold till he got a payment on it. About half past four Hay came into the yard and attempted to draw away the democrat. The plaintiff said there was a bill against it and he would not let it go. Further words ensued and Hay reached to his pocket and drew out a knife about four inches long. Then he attempted to stab the democrat in the back and the plaintiff jumped on him and defendant again pulled out an open knife and lunged at the plaintiff.

Young then picked up a piece of board lying at his feet to defend himself. Young asked defendant what he was going to do with the knife and he replied he was going to use it. Hay told a friend with him to take the knife from Jones, another employee, stopped the second man, Hay slashed at Jones' hand but the latter caught the wheel.

Eventually the friend whose name is Joseph Price, got the wagon away and Hay took the board from Young. Evidence was taken at the present time and the plaintiff with him on the board on the head, but his hand intercepted the blow.

Seeing that the wagon had been taken Young then telephoned for the police and later went to the station and laid an information.

Evidence was also heard from Joseph D. Jones, who is employed at the stables; and William J. Lindsay, a dray driver, who witnessed the quarrel between the two men.

This closed the case for the prosecution and Mr. Allison for the defence stated that he did not intend to put in any evidence at the present time. The magistrate thereupon committed Hay for trial at the next meeting of the Supreme Court in November.

C.N.R. MUST STOP SUNDAY. From Thursday's Bulletin. "If the construction work which has been in progress for some time on Sundays in defiance of the Lord's Day act be continued by the Canadian Northern, we will take action against them," said J. D. Blayney, president of the Temperance and Moral Reform league, to a Bulletin representative this morning.

Mr. Blayney, continuing, stated that this railway had been openly defiant of the Lord's Day act for some time and even went so far as to have gangs of men working on the line on the Lord's day.
