

LONDON, Feb. 19. (Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency)— Speaking here to-day, Right Hon. Winston Spencer Churchill said, we are recruiting a new army for two and three years service, at the rate of over a thousand daily. It was es-sential, in order to disarm Germany, and secure the reparation which we are determined to get, to maintain a strong and well disciplined army on the Rhine. There was no intention of sending a large British force to Russia, Mr. Churchill, said. If Rus-sia is to be saved it must be by her own exertion. LONDON, Feb. 19. tribute to the demise of the late C.
