### Newfoundland

#### Take Notice.

Ottawa, Mar. 8.—The high cost of railways operation will ruin the development of Canada in the immediate future, Hon. J. D. Reid, Minister of Railways, told the House of Commons late to-night. The McAdoo award, he said, had done Canadian railways a great deal of harm and railway workers themselves should take the problem into consideration. The increased estimates for railways, tabled to-day, said Dr. Reid, should not be taken as meaning that there will necessarily be a big deficit in the operation of railways this year. The officials of the various roads that go to make up the Canadian National Railways, he said, had estimated that there will be a loss of some \$50,000,000 this year, in one way and another. In addition to this there will be large amounts required for extensions, and also certain refunds on behalf of Grand Trunk stock which the government will have to take care of. The United States railways are losing even larger amounts in proportion, said the minister.

#### Railway Estimates.

Railway estimates to be submitted in the House of Commons are large. The Grand Trunk's are greater than those of any other system.

Insofar as the estimates themselves are concerned, although constituting a liability on the Grand Trunk, it is stated the analysis of the Grand Trunk system indicates that some \$57,000,000 will be required. The net result is that the total railway obligations requiring cash are some \$140,000,000 as against the \$178,000,000 for which an appropriation is to be asked.

The Grand Trunk system it is declared is not "merely attributable to operating deficits" as the Grand Trunk is faced with current and overdue liability amounting to twenty million dollars, as well as substantial payments which will have to be made for sinking fund and for refunding purposes. In addition to this, the Grand Trunk operating officers estimate that a new capital expenditure of \$12,000,000 should be made.

#### Road Requirements.

The estimates provide \$28,700,000 for the Grand Trunk Pacific, of which \$1,250,000 is for operating deficit, and some \$8,000,000 for interest requirements and fixed charges. Some \$6,000,000 is provided for betterment. The Canadian National requirements are made up of operating deficit of \$7,000,000 on the intercolonial and transcontinental railways and \$23,000,000 for operating deficits and fixed charges on Canadian Northern. The operating deficit in this case amounts to between \$4,000,000 and \$5,000,000, and interest and fixed charges constituting the balance. The volume is to be used by betterment, new construction of western lines and stock requirements.

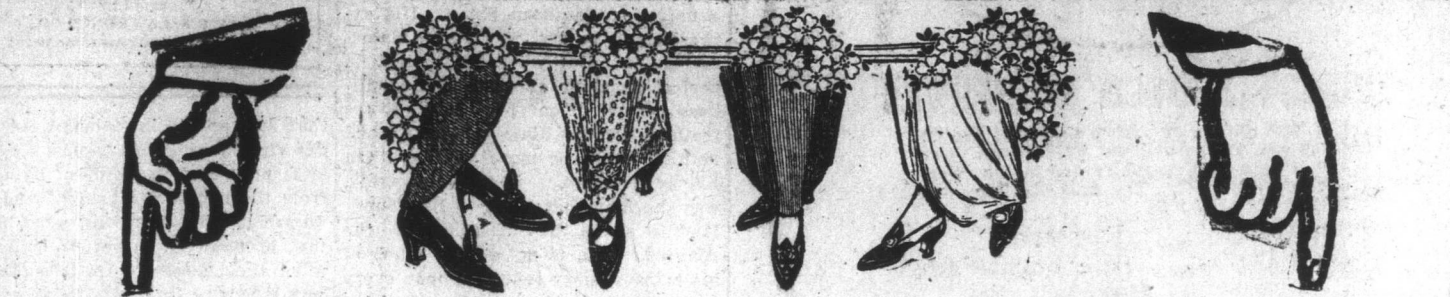
