South Must Not Coerce Ulster.

**Churchill's Statement to Commons
-- Jury Returns Murder Verdict
Against Connolly and O'Brien --
Berlin May Have Monarchist De-
monstrations -- Britton Won
Championship on a Foul.**

NOT SATISFIED WITH IRISH SITU- ATION.

LONDON, June 26. After a debate which was not so de-
bated or acrimonious as expected, the
government tonight won a virtual vote
of confidence on its Irish policy when
the "Die-Hard" motion for the res-
toration of the Chief Secretary for
Ireland's salary, as an expression of
disapproval of the Government's policy
and failure to afford police protection
for Field Marshal Wilson, was defeated.
The vote was 342 to 75. Winston Churchill, Secretary for the
Colonies, in a statement on Irish af-
fairs made it clear that the Imperial
Government would expect the provi-
sional Government, now that it had se-
cured the people's mandate, to take
the necessary steps to assert its com-
plete authority, and with equal fran-
kness emphasized that the British Gov-
ernment could not allow coercion of
Ulster by the South, in fact that failure
to observe the treaty would mean the
British Government resuming com-
plete freedom of action. Opinions ex-
pressed in the lobbies leaned on the
fact that the Prime Minister's speech
was more gloomy than usual, and his
reluctance to make any confident pre-
dictions as to the course of events and
also that the debate had centered less
on the murder of Field Marshal Wilson
than on the fate of the treaty.
Mr. Churchill's speech was taken to
indicate that what amounted to an ul-
timum had been sent to the Provin-
tial Government, but he was frank-
ly disappointed by the manner which
was grappling with its problems.

WITFUL MURDER VERDICT.

LONDON, June 26. A verdict of wilful murder against
James Connolly and James O'Brien,
was returned by the Coroner's Jury
in the inquest into the killing of Field
Marshal Sir Henry Wilson, assassin-
ed last Thursday. Witnesses, whose
names are withheld, added little to the
details of the tragedy already pub-
lished.

PRINCE OF MONACO DEAD.

PARIS, June 26. Prince Albert Honore of the Princ-
ality of Monaco died here this after-
noon. On June 10, the Prince was op-
erated upon for intestinal trouble.

WON ON A FOUL.

NEW YORK, June 26. Jack Britton, world welterweight

boxing champion, won from Benny
Leonard, lightweight champion here
to-day, on a foul in the thirteenth
round.

THE MINE WAR INQUEST.

HERRIN, Ill., June 26. The Coroner's Jury, which held in-
quest into the death of the victims of
the mine war in Williamson County,
found, as so recorded, that C.K. Day-
el, Superintendent of Lester Mine, killed
one Union Miner the day before the
massacre, following the stopping of
Lester mine by five thousand Union
sympathizers. Of nineteen other dead,
including two strikers, the jury found
they came to death by gunshot wounds
inflicted by persons unknown. Re-
presentatives of the Department of
Justice are investigating but no ar-
rests are yet made.

MONARCHIST PLOTTING.

LONDON, June 26. The Berlin correspondent of the
Westminster Gazette forecasts the re-
signation of Minister of Defence Ges-
ler, following Monarchist demonstra-
tions of part of the Reichswehr. Only
doubt of the dependability of the
Reichswehr prevented a declaration
of Martial Law, the correspondent
adds.

FIRE AT STEVESTON.

VANCOUVER, June 26. Several hundred persons, chiefly or-
ientals, lost their homes and property,
worth \$150,000, by fire which swept
the fishing village of Steveston on the
Fraser River last night.
