LONDON April 9 The House of Commons to-night passed the second reading of the West Indian telegraph bill providing for the expenditure of \$400,000 for the establishment of cable and wireless communication in the British West Indies and British Guiana. The measure was introduced for the purpose of linking together the British possessions and the mother country to prevent Imperial communications falling iuto foreign hands.
