GREAT DISTRESS AT COVENTRY.—A second calamity, in the form of general distress, the intensity of which is described by one of the local papers as being unprecedented, has fallen upon Coventry. The staple trade of the city, that or ribbon weaving, is in a fearful depressed state, in consequence of which thousands of bands are out of employment, and are depending entirely for their subsistence upon the assistance of their neighbours, and the scanty delt of the parish. The distress has been greatly aggravated by the recent failures of large firms. The flabilities of the bankrupts are exceedingly heavy, those of the most recent case being estimated at £100, 600. Before stoppage, each of the bankrupts firms provided partial employment for their hands, all of whom are now left in a state of utter desitution.
